YAHWEH IS LEADING:

Put that Scripture again, servant.

(1) In the past God spoke to our ancestors through the prophets at many times and in various ways, (2) but in these last days He has spoken to us by His Son, whom He appointed heir of all things, and through whom also He made the universe. (3) The Son is the radiance of God's glory and the exact representation of His being, sustaining all things by His powerful word. After He had provided purification for sins, He sat down at the right hand of the Majesty in heaven. (4) So He became as much superior to the angels as the name He has inherited is superior to theirs.

—Hebrews 1:1-4 NIV

YAHWEH CONTINUES:

Use logic. Your argument does not have valid backing. Logical thinking would say, "God used prophets as a main outlet for sharing what the course would come forward as, and then Yahweh chose to have the Son come forward and offer final placement as the Word made flesh, but in both parts of the written Word, Yahweh brought forward what plan He would say through whatever vessel would come forward."

told Yahweh's plan. And look at the New Covenant when King Jesus came forward; was there a closing off of the canon by man? What happened after Hebrews One was penned? Look at how there are prophets mentioned in the Book of Revelation. Does your logic stand up to what is written? For to say there cannot be any more prophets would say that the Book of Revelation is a lie.

God will bring those witnesses forward to show Yahweh's plan.

Your understanding of Hebrews is lacking. The way of Christ's coming is a sealed covenant of blood, and no word would overturn Yahweh the Son.
